GLEN HAROLD ABPLANALP is a resident of Ridgewood, New Jersey. He graduated from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute with a degree of Civil Engineer in 1936. He later attended and graduated from Fordham University Law School in 1943 and served with the Seabees in the Pacific during World War II.

Before retiring in 1984, Abplanalp was vice president and principal-in charge of the New Jersey office of Havens and Emerson. He currently serves this firm as a staff consultant.

Abplanalp served as President of the Metropolitan New York chapter.

In 1959 Abplanalp was elected to the Institute Board of Directors. He served for two years before being elected Institute President in 1961.

Abplanalp served on the CSI Technical Review Board, and the Long Range Planning Committee. He also served as

chairman of the Institute's Advisory Board and the Jury of Fellows. He represented CSI at the Joint Industry Conference on Uniform Indexing.

Abplanalp was a frequent lecturer on construction related issues. For many years he wrote The Construction Specifier's 'Legal Points' column. He has frequently been a featured speaker on legal issues at CSI Conventions.

For many years, Abplanalp represented CSI on the Engineers Joint Documents Committee. As chairman of this committee, Abplanalp lead the way toward interdisciplinary agreement on the form of standard construction documents.

Abplanalp is a diplomate and trustee of the American Academy of Environmental Engineers, a life member of the American Water Works Association, a Fellow of the American Consulting Engineers Council and a Fellow and Life member of the American Society of Civil Engineers.
