CHARLES R. CARROLL, Jr., was born in Richmond, Virginia. After service in World War II he attended and graduated from Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore Maryland in 1950 with a Bachelor of Science Degree.

For many years Carroll was manager of Specifier Market Development for United States Plywood Corporation in New York.

He joined CSI in 1958 as a member of the D.C. Metro Chapter. In 1959, he helped found the Baltimore Chapter and served as its first Secretary. He was subsequently elected to

the Board of the Baltimore chapter and served as a Director until 1965.

In 1964, Carroll was elected to a two year term as Institute Director for CSI's Eastern Section. As membership increased, the Eastern Section was reapportioned, and Carroll continued in office as Director from the Northeastern Section. In 1966, he was elected to the first of two terms as Treasurer, serving from 1966 until 1970. In 1970 he was elected Institute Vice President.

Carroll is presently Executive Director of the Construction Sciences Research Foundation.
