EDWARD (TED) HEALY is the oldest son of the late Bernard E Healy, RA; the grandson of Edward Marchant, the nephew of Edward Marchant, Jr. the uncle of Edward Marchant III, and a brother to Lamont and Bernard E. Healy, Jr. Respectively, those relatives were or are the 1970 President of the Society of American Registered Architects, who named and created the first Dunkin' Donuts; the founder and principal of Edward Marchant Plumbing; a master plumber; a Harvard Kennedy School of Government lecturer in Real Estate Development; a registered land surveyor; and a real estate developer. Ted commuted five years from Weymouth to Cambridge, MA, where he received his Bachelor of Architecture degree from MIT in 1953. All the above is mentioned only to indicate a rather unique gene mix possibly accounting for the persistence, humor, and creativity that Ted brought to his membership in CSI.

Ted is a Charter Member of the Worcester County Chapter, and has been active in leadership roles at all levels of the Institute. He credits CSI and interaction with its knowledgeable members with his early technical development. The development of his *Ol' Argyle* persona, complete with the *Genuine Ol' Argyle Sox*, his advocacy of audacity, and the utilization of his quirky sense of humor came along in the later decades as a device to deliver the CSI message to attentive audiences. Occasionally, as editor of chapter, Northeast Region, and Institute publications and presentations at all CSI levels, he has been known to morph into *Argyila the Worcester Hun* to deliver argylian rants against less than effective CSI performance.

After service in five decades he remains creatively active and, as he is elevated to Fellowship, he continues to serve as the creator and editor of *MEMCOMMunications*, the monthly bulletin of the Institute Membership Committee; the NE Region Secretary; and also as a chapter director, consistently delivering the CSI message of building membership value and growth through communication of chapter best practices.
