In the year 2000, RICHARD (Dick) C. ROBINSON celebrated a twenty-nine year association with CSI. During that period, he has served as an example of a dedicated volunteer to the organization for new and younger members to emulate. Over that twenty-nine year period, he has served the Institute at the local, regional and national levels in various office positions and numerous committee responsibilities.

Education of other professionals and activities assisting students in a philanthropic manner through the activities of the Dallas CSI Foundation has been important throughout his career. Having served as the local Education Chair, Region Education Chair and as a member of the Institute Education Committee, he has worked to make available educational opportunities for all professionals in the area of continuing education. While serving as President of his Chapter, the Dallas Chapter received the J. Norman Hunter Memorial Award for its extensive educational programming that year and outreach to other professional organizations. He

continues to serve as the coordinator for the Chapter's on-going Certification Study Classes.

In 1993, Robinson received the Dallas Chapter's highest award, the Henry T. J. Martin Award (only 12 had been awarded since 1966) and later was the recipient in 1998 of the Terrell R. Harper Award (only 5 had been awarded since 1989)

As President of the Dallas CSI Foundation, he has led the Foundation to new levels of funding income as well as increasing the amount and number of scholarships available to Dallas/Fort Worth area students attending schools located within the South Central Region pursuing degrees in architecture, architectural engineering or the construction sciences. Under his leadership, the corpus of the Foundation has nearly doubled to over \$90,000 while continuing to fund over \$6,500 annually in scholarships.

A graduate of the University of Texas at Austin with a Bachelor of Architecture in 1969, Robinson has become a "Dallas native" living in Dallas since graduation. He has been a principal in his architectural firm since 1978.
